new **Island Helicopters** tour to the 400-foot waterfalls featured in *Jurassic Park* (islandhelicopters.com), or eschew Hollywood altogether and venture into the forest with **Outfitters Kauai** via a new zip-line course (outfitterskauai.com).
Check in: While elegant, the **St. Regis Princeville Resort** doesn't neglect the kids. Instead, ocean butlers teach island ecology and pint-sized lounge chairs can be found poolside (rooms from \$850, stregisprinceville.com).

Fort Lauderdale, Fla.

Check in: The just-opened kids-only Surf Club at the shorefront **Harbor Beach Marriott Resort & Spa** aims to outdo the ocean with a clubhouse surf simulator — kids ride a longboard and see their moves on a screen with this Nintendo-Wii-like video game. The club also offers iMacs, Xbox 360s, and a theater with a 65-inch screen (rooms from \$259, marriottharborbeach.com).
Explore: Broward County just erected its **92nd artificial reef** off Hugh Taylor Birch State Park's north end to expand the native fish habitat. Plunge into the underwater world with **Pro Dive International** (prodiveusa.com).

AT SEA

Europe

What to expect: **Tauk Bridges'** new family-specific departures are the easiest way to capital-hop through Europe this summer. The Blue Danube: Family Riverboat Adventure trip visits Bratislava, Vienna, Linz, and Regensburg, with an excursion to Salzburg. Enjoy castle visits and sightseeing, plus whitewater rafting, marzipan sculpting, and, onboard the boat, kite-flying from the top deck.
Booking details: Eight-day trips start at \$2,790 per person for July 1 and July 29 departures (tauck.com).

Alaska

What's on: Summer is cruise season in the 49th state, and **Princess Cruises** offers a new family package bundling seven nights at sea with five nights in the inland wilderness. After watching rivers of ice calve in Glacier Bay and hiking on a glacier in Juneau, board a train from Whittier for parts north. Tour via jet boat near Mount McKinley, watch for wildlife in Denali National Park, and pan for gold at a former mining site.
Booking details: Twelve-night tours start at \$1,743 per person for the first two passengers and \$1191 per person for the third and fourth in the same cabin on weekly departures through August (princess.com).

EXOTIC JOURNEYS

Mongolia

What to expect: This year, **Nomadic Expeditions** introduces family trips for parents with kids ages 3-12. Highlights include riding camels across the Gobi desert, exploring a national park on horseback, meeting nomadic herding families, and uncovering dinosaur fossils at excavation sites.

Booking details: The customized family trips depart **May** through **October** for 10-12 days. Prices start at \$238 per day per child, \$289 per day per adult (nomadicexpeditions.com).

Kenya and Tanzania

What to expect: Track the Big Five on family game drives with **Micato Safaris**. Its updated Family-to-Family Safari still visits the famed Ngorongoro Crater, home to 20,000 different wildlife species, and puts you elbow to elbow with Masai children, but now adds a stay at Kenya's Loisaba Lodge. The 60,000-acre private reserve touts camelback safaris, ATV rides, river rafting, and outdoor overnights in cozy four-poster beds.
Booking details: Sixteen-day trips start at \$13,730 for adults, \$10,910 for kids up to age 16, with eight departures this summer (micato.com).
